








#### TWDB ALSO RECEIVED FUNDING TO...

- Acquire high-resolution land surface (LiDAR) data to better evaluate floodplains and flooding levels;
- Develop hydraulic river models for priority watersheds;
- Develop coastal circulation and rainfall-runoff models;
- Update reservoir flood pool measurements;
- Expand the TexMesonet earth observation network;
- Create a web-based flood dashboard/water data hub






