




HWC Overview

- Develop Forest Conservation Easement Program
- Develop forest practitioner enrollment program for sustainable forest management
- Goal: 100,000 acres of working forests in Susquehanna Basin
- Bonus: \$50 million SRF loans to conserve 60,000 acres of forests in north central PA



National Funding of Green Projects through CWSRF

- Funding spiked in recession recovery years
- Green Project Reserve mandate has persisted –at least 10% of lending must be for "green" projects
- Green has fairly broad interpretation
- Only 1-2% of CWSRF funds have been lent to Nonpoint Pollution Projects




Figure 1 - Green Project Reserve




Water Quality Improvement Project

Advance a portion of interest to sponsorship project when loan is made

	Loan Amount	Interest Rate (r)	Annual Amortized Cost*
CWSRF Loan	\$800,000	2%	\$35,484
CWSRF Loan with Sponsored Project	\$1,000,000	0.4%	\$35,376



Water Resource Restoration Sponsor Program (WRRSP)

"the goal of the WRRSP is to counter the loss of ecological function and biological diversity that jeopardizes the health of Ohio's water resources"

- Initiated in 2000
- \$185,000,000 provided to projects
- 5,000 acres of wetlands protected; 700 acres restored
- 90 miles of stream protected; 22 miles restored
- 12 dams removed
- Program provides \$15 million each year divided equally between protection and restoration

Non-point source protection and restoration projects using water infrastructure financing

The Challenge

- Scale of projects

The Solutions

- Traditional revenue streams ratepayers, donors, etc.
- Non-traditional revenue streams timber, carbon
- Sponsorship model variable interest rates as an incentive
